



Upper School Academic Probation.

From the combination of effort grades and achievement grades (1-7) you will be able to establish if your son/daughter is about to begin a period of academic probation for the second quarter. The criteria for Academic Probation are outlined below.

Upper School

Achievement

A student will be placed on academic probation if they receive **two grades of 2** or **one grade of 1**

Effort

A student will be placed on academic probation if they receive **two Mediocre effort grades** or **one Unacceptable effort grade**

If your son/daughter is on Academic probation you will soon receive an e-mail from either the Upper School administration which will further outline the Academic probation procedures and implications.

Middle School

In the Middle School, it is the **semester** and not the quarter report which determines whether or not a student qualifies for academic probation. The criteria for Academic Probation are outlined below.

Achievement

A student will be placed on academic probation if they receive **one grade of 1, two grades of 2 or three grades of 3 or less.**

Effort

A student will be placed on academic probation if they receive **two Mediocre effort grades** or **one Unacceptable effort grade**

If a student meets the criteria for academic probation in the first or third quarters, they will receive a warning letter from the Middle School. A student will only be placed on academic probation at the end of semester 1 and 2 and the probation will run for the whole of the subsequent semester.
